Directions:

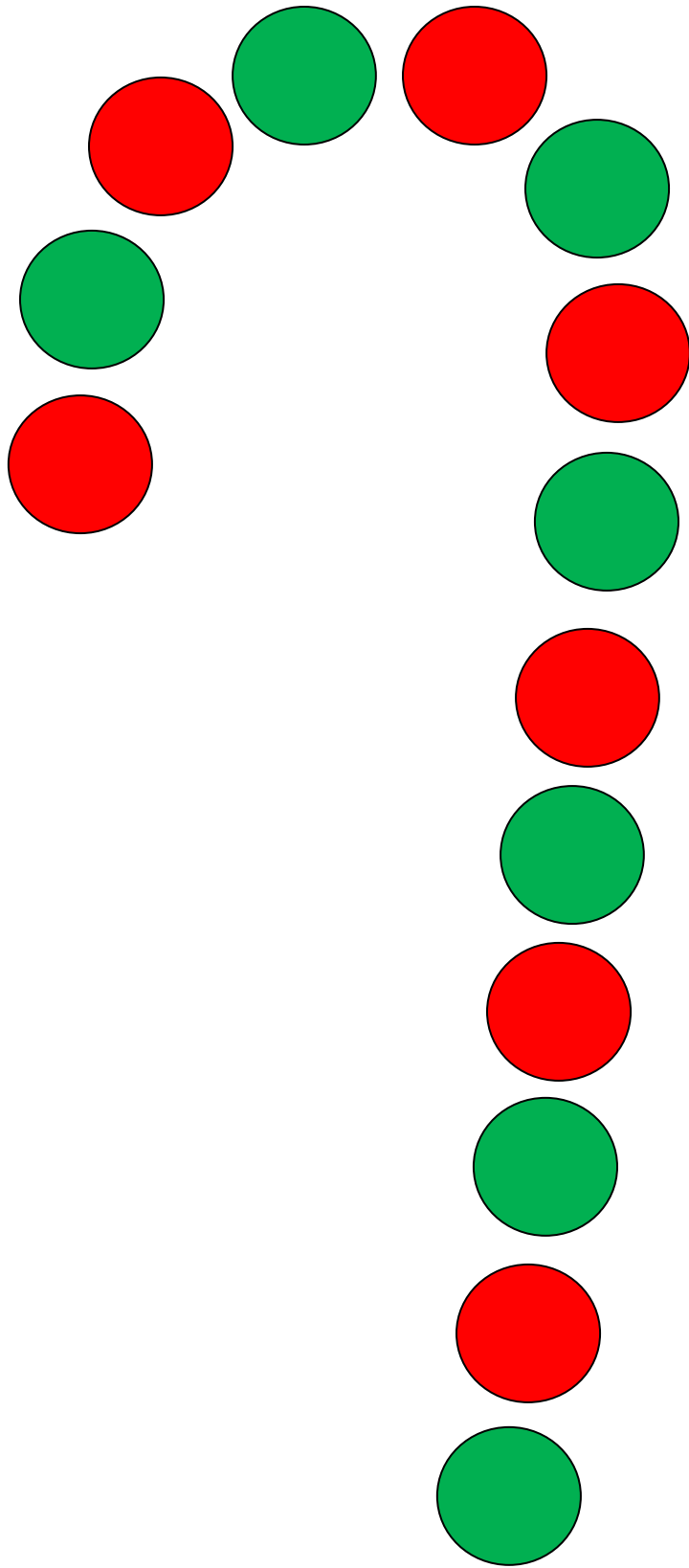
- Print the colored candy cane patterns on cardstock and laminate (or use a sleeve protector)
- Print the blank template onto cardstock as well
- Give one of the candy cane patterns to your child. Using do-a-dot paint, the child makes the same pattern on the blank candy cane.

Variations:

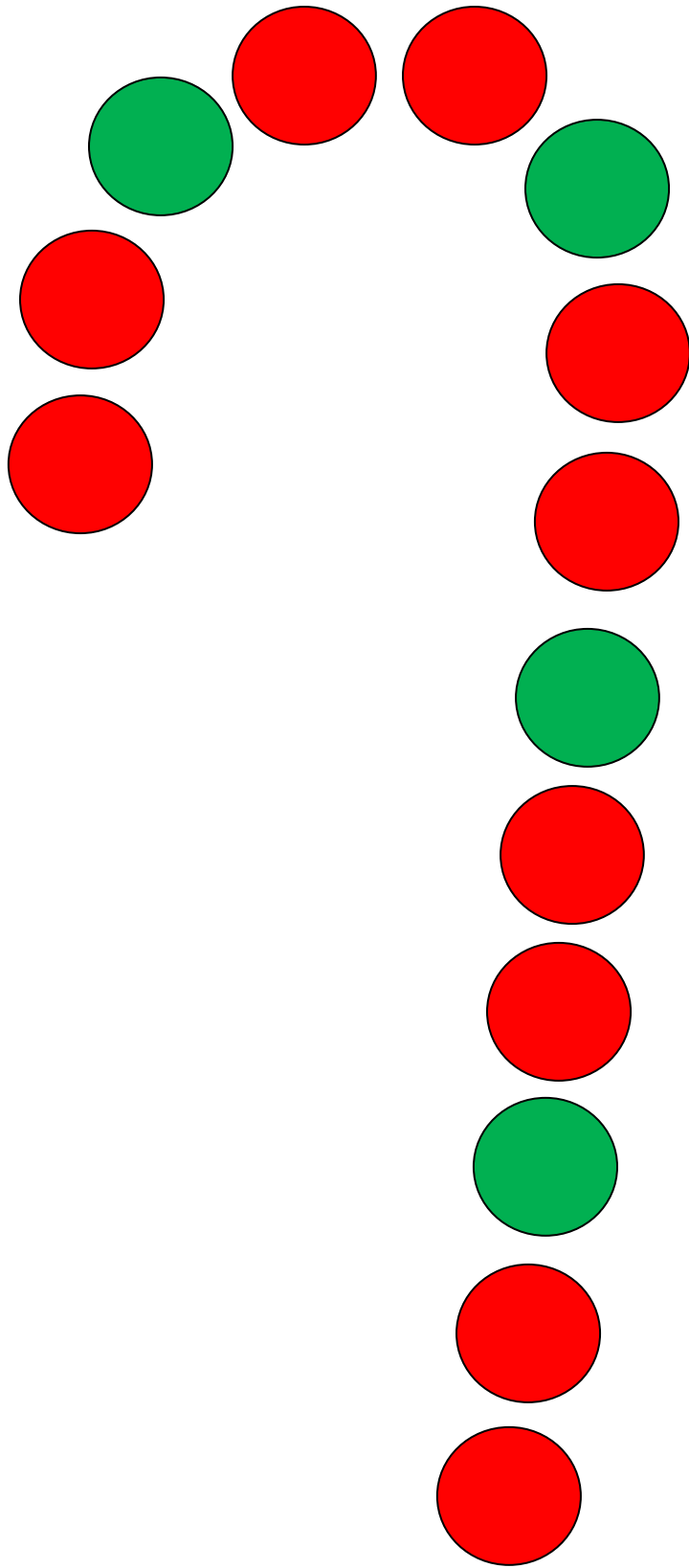
- Use the blank template and make your own pattern with the do-a-dot paint and have your child copy on a blank template.
- For older children, start a pattern with do-a-dot paint on the blank template, then let the child continue the pattern on his own.
- Students can also start their own candy cane patterns to have classmates identify and continue.

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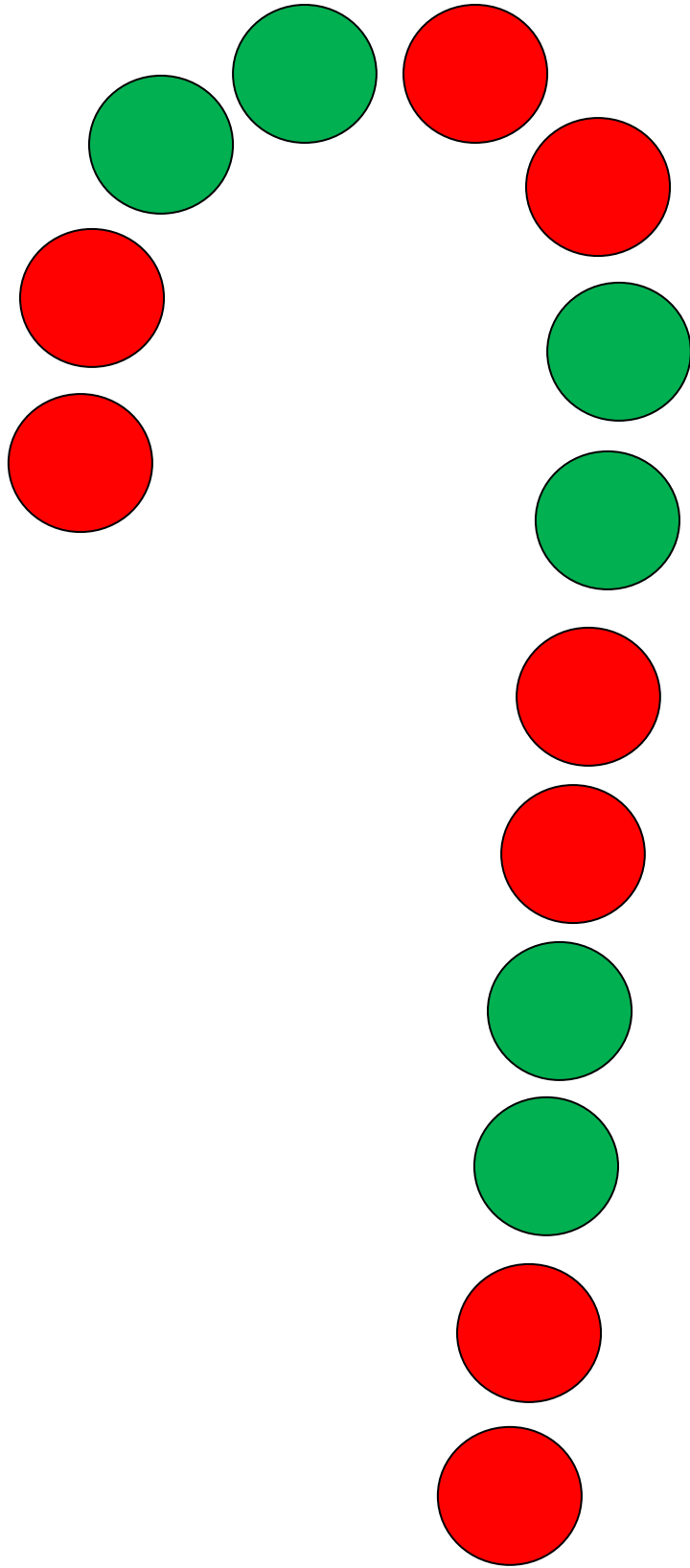
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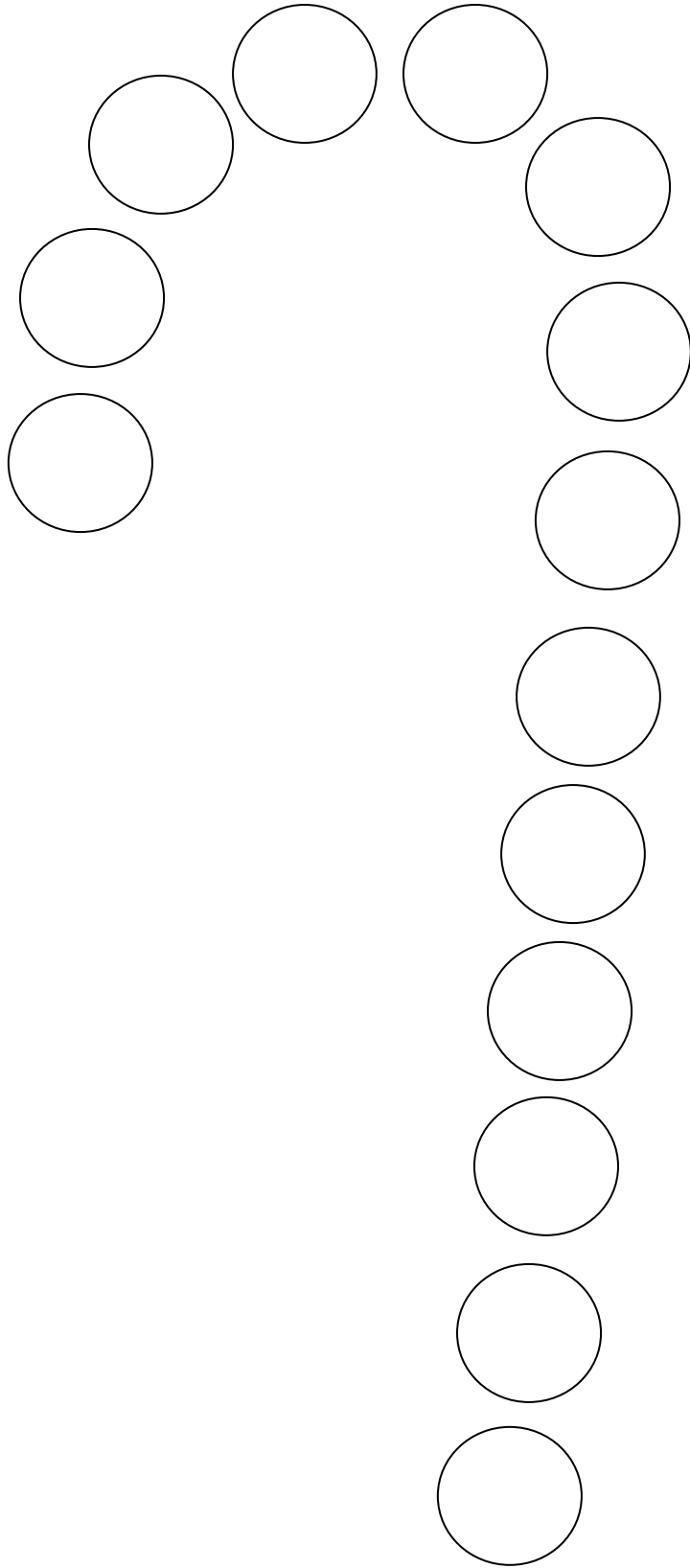
AB Pattern
