Gradually release the responsibility and limit support as it is re-read.

all that you can see.




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The world was a drab mass of

the stars that
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
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

At last, God sat back. He was glad He had made it all and said it was good and grand. He had made it with His mighty Hand.

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
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


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

based on Genesis 3




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
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Adam and Eve were in the garden of rest that God had made. It was the best place to be and they spent a lot of time with God.

But God saw Noah. He was a good pick because he did right.




God said, "The sky will split open and rain will spill from it. It will fill the world and kill all men and animals. But this will miss your family. Make a big ship, an ark."

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
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A Promise from God

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A long time after Noah, there was a man by the name of Abraham.




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God told him to leave his dad's flocks, crops, and sod and go to a new spot of land. Abraham told his family what God had said.



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The man who kept Pharaoh's cup told him about Joseph. He met Joseph in jail and when he had a dream, Joseph told him all about it.


"Run! Rush him up here!" said Pharaoh.
