


Cut apart the Thanksgiving pictures below. Paste them on the cornucopia page, matching the beginning sounds to each letter.




Picture Key: Pilgrim, corn, ham, Mayflower, family, turkey, vegetables, leaves

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DIRECTIONS:

Cut out the pictures and paste them all around the PRAY. Say each picture's name as your child glues them down to demonstrate how they rhyme. If the child is ready, see if he can brainstorm more rhyming words (real & silly words).

Roll-a-Syllable (Thanksgiving Version)

Prep Work:

Print off picture inserts onto cardstock, cut out, and insert into education cubes. If you do not have education cubes, you can purchase them from <u>www.amazon.com</u> (they're called Photo Stacking Blocks), make your own dice with a cardboard box (such as a Priority Mail box), or use the syllable game from Pack 1 instead.

How to Play:

EASY VERSION- Insert 6 pictures into one die: 2 one-syllable pictures, 2 two-syllable pictures, and 2 three-syllable pictures. Players take turns rolling one die, saying the object's name (such as "tur-key"), and telling how many syllables or big parts each word has.


HARDER VERSION- Insert 6 pictures into two dice: for example 2 one-syllable pictures, 2 two-syllable pictures, and 2 three-syllable pictures in each die. Players take turns rolling the two dice, saying the name of the objects on each die like this "tur-key"; then telling if they have the same number of syllables (big parts) or not.










Thanksgiving Print Awareness

Directions:

•On a separate piece of paper, ask the child to draw, place stickers/stamps, or cut and glue pictures from magazines of things for which he is thankful.

- •Ask the child to try it, too!











Print onto cardstock, laminate, and cut out. Hole punch around the edge of each picture to create lacing cards. Great for building fine motor skills!

Print onto cardstock and laminate. Hole punch around the edge of each picture to create lacing cards. Great for building fine motor skills!




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Thanksgiving Cut & Pattern Cards

*I recommend printing these onto cardstock to make it easier for the child to cut.

*To prepare for the child, cut along the darker, horizontal lines first to create 4 separate strips. (like the strip below)




*Give the strips to the child and ask her to cut along each dotted line to make six separate picture cards for each row.

*This can be used as a stand-alone cutting activity OR the little cards can then be used to make patterns together with your child such as turkey, pumpkin, turkey, pumpkin, etc.

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Hide the Turkey in the Straw 20-Grid

To Prep:

*Print onto cardstock and laminate for durability.

(Print one turkey game board and one straw bale page for each player)

*Cut apart straw bales on dotted lines.

*Locate a die, labeled 1-6.

To Play: (for 2 players)

*Each player needs a turkey game board and 20 straw bales.

*The first player rolls the die, counts the number of dots, and places that many straw bales on top of his turkeys to "hide" them. For example, if the player rolls a 2, he takes two straw bales and hides two of the turkeys on his game board.

*The first player to cover all of his turkeys, wins!

Variations:

*If only one person is playing, he continues to roll and count the die, placing straw onto his game board until they are all covered.

*Use the straw bale page as cutting practice. Simply cut along all the horizontal lines and ask the child to cut along all the vertical lines.



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









Turkey Numbers-1 die



Turkey Sums- 2 dice



Roll 2 dice. Add up the two numbers. Find the sum on the turkey picture and cover.

How Many Turkeys are Hiding in the Woods?

Print the woods mat and number cards onto cardstock and laminate for durability.

 $VERSION \ 1 \ (\text{easier})$

*Place some turkeys on the woods mat. *Ask your child to count the number of turkeys. *Help him locate the number (from the number cards, p. 24)

VERSION 2 (harder)

*Place some turkeys on the woods mat.


*Ask your child to count the number of turkeys.

*Help him locate and trace the correct number (with the number tracer cards)


$VERSION \ 3 \ (hardest)$


*Place some turkeys on the left side of the woods mat and more on the right side. *Pose is as a problem to the child such as "There were 2 turkeys hiding in the woods. Then 2 more found a place to hide. How many turkeys are there now?" *The child solves the problem and locates the number (from the number cards) OR locates and traces the number (with the number tracer cards).

Those children who are ready for it could write the number without tracing or write the number sentence!



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
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Cut out turkeys and use to place on the woods mat.

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


Number Tracing Cards 1-20




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Number Tracing Cards 1-20




*The green dot indicates where the child should start writing the number.

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
