- *Ask kids to write the words they make on the recording sheets (a great accountability piece.)

















CUT & PASTE SHORT VOWEL PAGES

2 LEVELS of WORK

Level I: All the words have that short vowel sound. Great for beginners. Level 2: Only 4 of the 6 images have the featured short vowel sound. Great for kids who have a good grasp of short vowel sounds and need an extra challenge.

- *Print off the short vowel mat of choice.
- *Print off the level of choice (level I or level 2).
- *Identify each image.
- *Students cut around the images that share the same middle vowel sound, and glue them down to the short vowel mat.
- *After they are all glued down, ask the child to touch each image and identify it, listening for the middle sound.










1-2-3 FLIP IT!

To Prep:

- Print off one game board for two players to share.
- Print off letter cards, cut out and laminate.




To Play:

- Deal each player 20 cards.
- Players place their 20 cards face down in a pile. Extra cards are not used.
- Decide who goes first.
- Player one starts the game by flipping over his top card. He looks at the number on the bottom of the card and places it in that space on the game board. The player reads the new word created (real or silly) aloud. *Use the hard sounds for c and g with younger readers who have not learned the rule for soft g and c, yet. For example, cit or gen could be pronounced with hard sounds.
- Player two then flips over his top card, looks at the number on the bottom, places it on the game board, and reads the new word aloud.
- Play is over when both players have used all 20 cards.
- Shuffle and play again.


- Depending on the age of the player(s), try using more or less cards.
- Players can receive points for every word read correctly.
- Players can receive points for every REAL word created on their turn.
- If you want to play with more than two players, copy the letter cards more than once.

1-2-3 **SPELL IT!**

I-2-3 SPELL IT! is meant to be more of a challenge for those readers and spellers who are ready to take it to the next level!





To Prep:

- Print off one game board for two players to share.
- Print off letter cards AND the Wild Cards (p. 121 of download)


To Play: (played similarly to *Uno*)


- Deal each player 7 cards.
- Players hold their 7 cards in their hand so they (but no one else) can see them.
 Extra cards are placed facedown in a pile.
- Decide who goes first.
- Player one starts the game by looking at the cards in his own hand to see if he can build another REAL word on the game board (remembering to pay attention to the number at the bottom right-hand corner of each card). If he is able to, he places his card down on the game board, reads the real word he made, and his turn is over (for example, he could turn *cat* in into *can*).
- If the player is not able to build another REAL word, he draws a card from the pile. If he draws a card that he can play, he does so and his turn is over.
- If a player draws a Wild Card, he can make that card change any letter he
 wants to create a real word. The player needs to state what letter his Wild Card
 represents.
- Play continues in this manner, with players taking turns, until one player runs out of cards.
- If more than 2 players want to play, print off more copies of the letter cards and Wild Cards.








To Prep:

- Print one game board per player (for 2-6 players)
- Laminate each board or place in a plastic sheet protector for multiple uses and durability
- Gather BINGO chip counters or use dry erase marker to cross through letters or words on the game boards
- Print the CVC picture cards on cardstock. Laminate for durability.


To Play:

- (Each person needs a game board and something with which to cross off or cover up the words on her board)
- Turn the CVC picture cards facedown in a pile
- Players take turns picking a Blend Bingo picture card, turning it over, and calling out the word
- All players look for that word on their BINGO board (it does not matter which column it is in)
- The first player to cover all her words in a row wins and shouts, "Blend BINGO!" (You can choose to play many different ways. For example: whoever covers all four corners or whoever covers all their words in a particular column first, etc.)







Short Vowel Sight Word Sorts

Print off and cut out all short vowel sight word cards.

Pick two vowel sounds to compare and sort. a/o, i/u, e/o, a/i, e/u, a/u, i/o make great pairs to compare. At first, avoid the pairs of a/e or e/i as they are very similar in sound and can be easily confused by readers.

For example, if you compare a and o, print off and cut out all the short a and short o words. Show your child a known sight word (maybe CAT) that has a short a sound. Then, show your child a known short o word, such as not.

Sort each word under the correct vowel sound, so the final sort might look something like:

catnothasdogandonhadgotcanstopoff

For an extra challenge, include one of the "oddball words" from page I50. WAS would be a great oddball word to mix into this sort because it has the CVC with the a in the middle, but the a doesn't make the short a sound.
