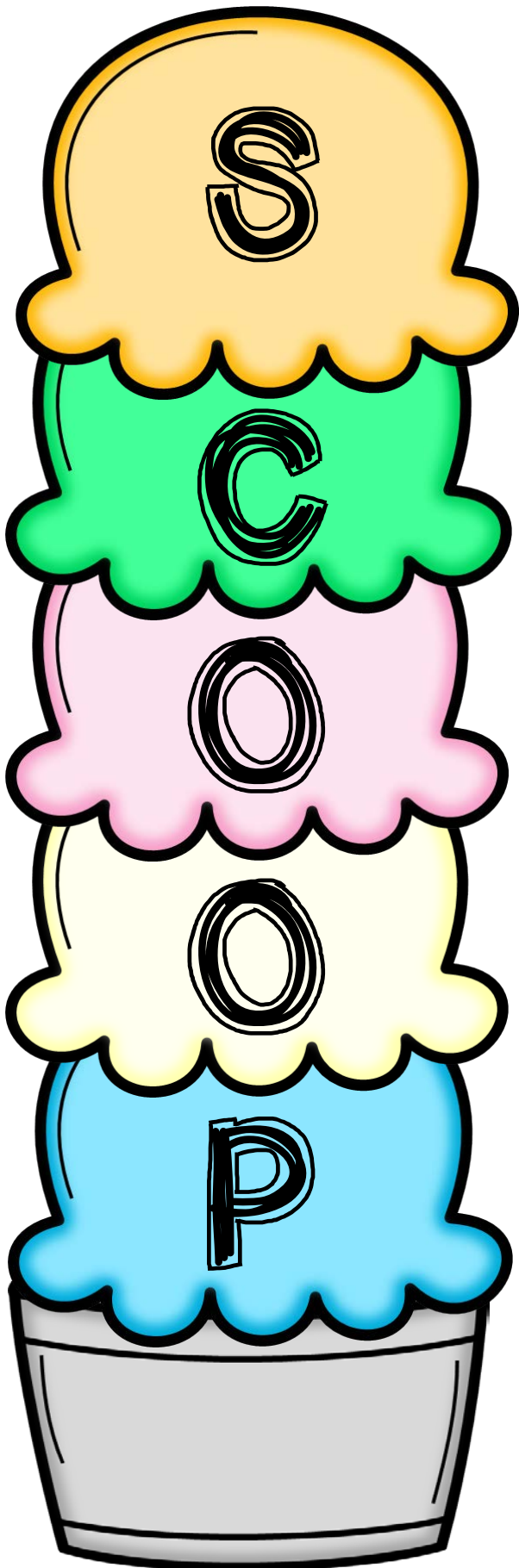

Tells WHEN and WHERE

2. Characters



WHO is in the story?

3. Oh no! (the problem)



What is the PROBLEM in the story?

4. Order of Events

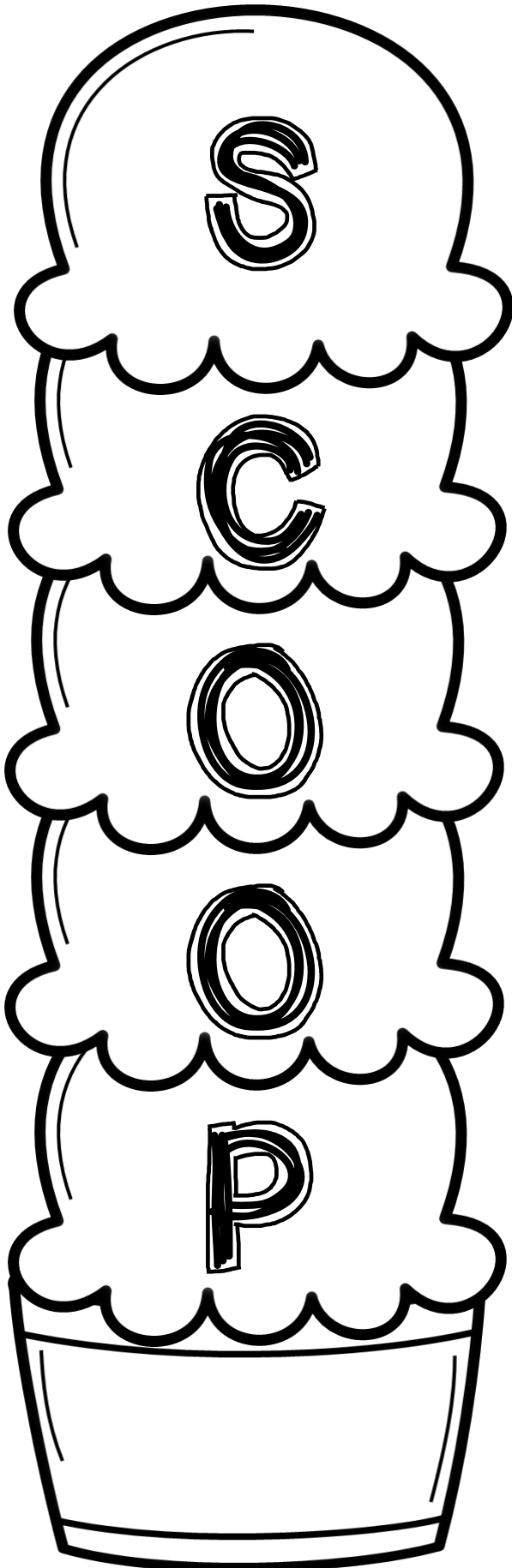
