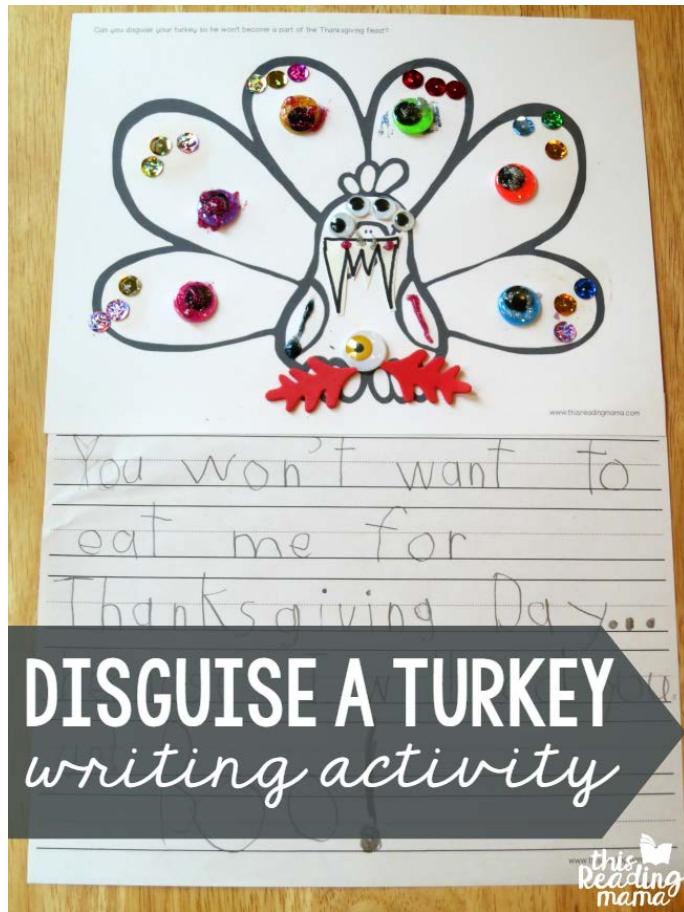
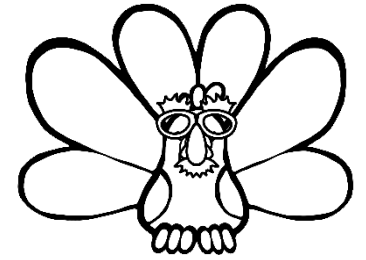


Disguise a Turkey

After students disguise their turkeys, they can use the paper to write a letter or a few sentences telling why he should not be eaten for Thanksgiving dinner.

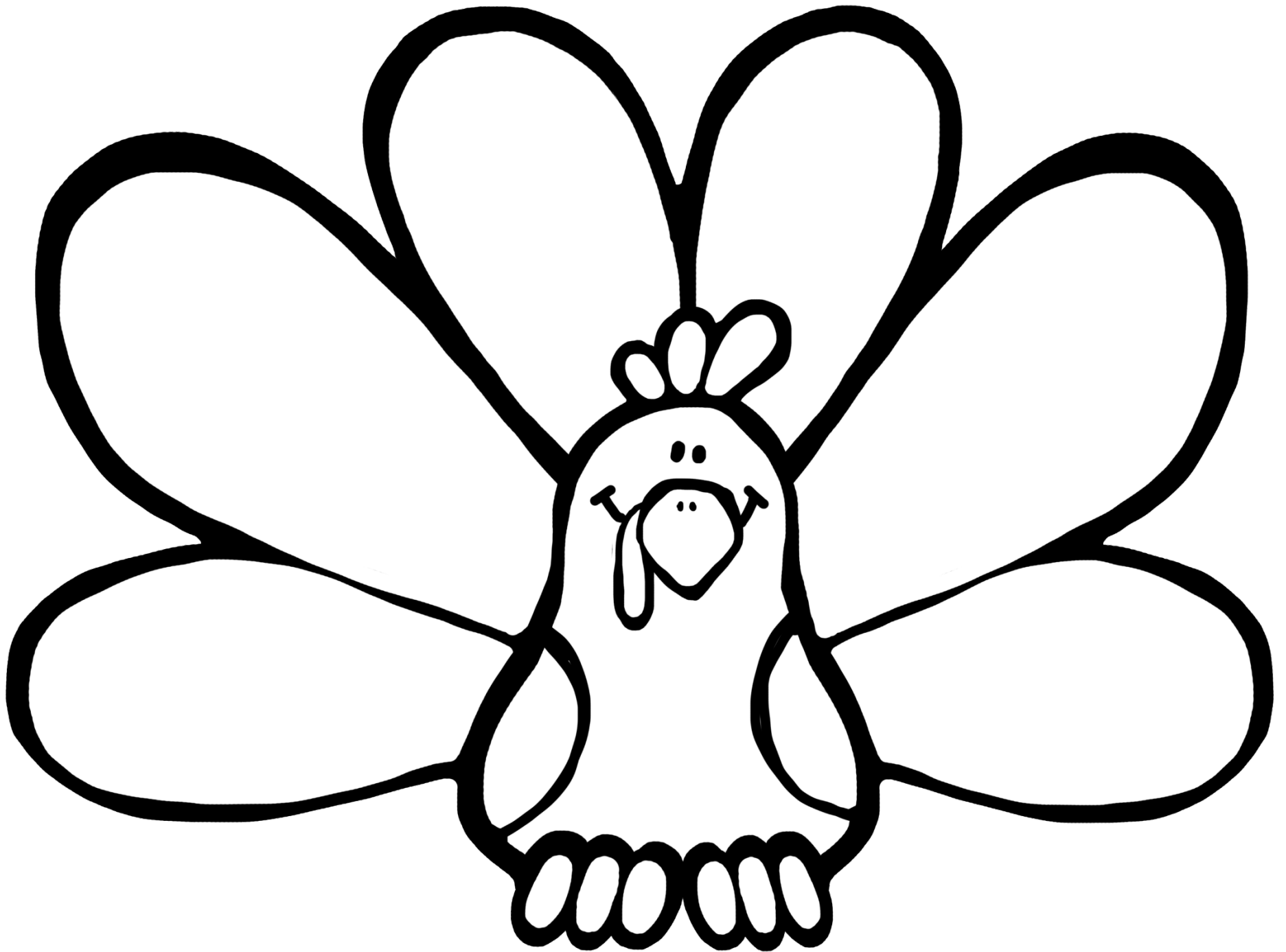
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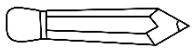
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Can you disguise your turkey so he won't become a part of the Thanksgiving feast?
