

Reading Strategy Cards

These reading strategy cards can help you meet the various needs of your K-3 readers.

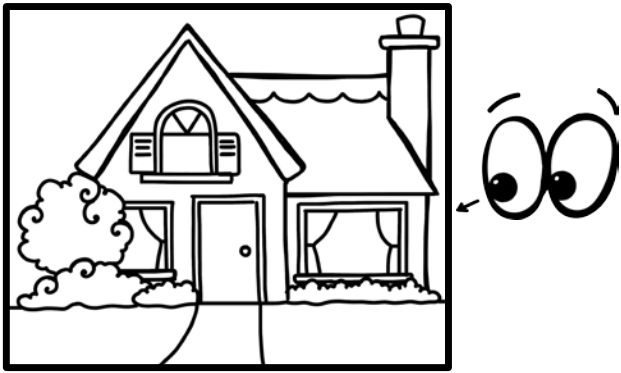
EMERGENT READER STRATEGIES: pp. 2-3 includes strategies best for emerging or beginning readers. These readers typically don't have a huge collection of phonics or spelling strategies yet. They rely heavily on context when they read (like looking at the picture).

DEVELOPING READER STRATEGIES: pp. 4-5 includes strategies for developing readers. These readers are moving away from using picture clues and rely more on word clues to help them figure out words. The words included in their reading begin to get longer, with base words + affixes.

Print onto colored paper, laminate, hole-punch, and clip onto a ring to make an easy to use flip book!

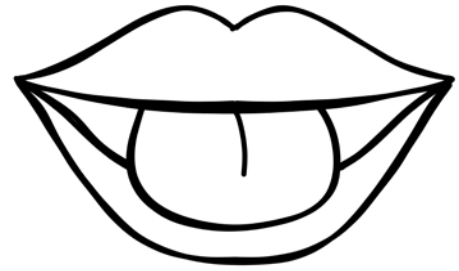

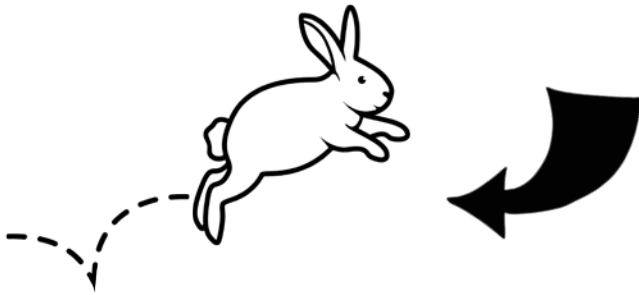

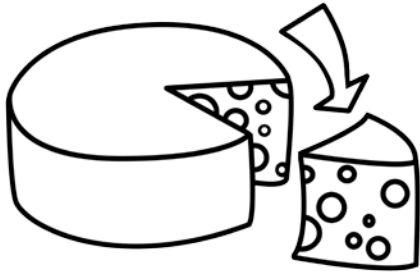

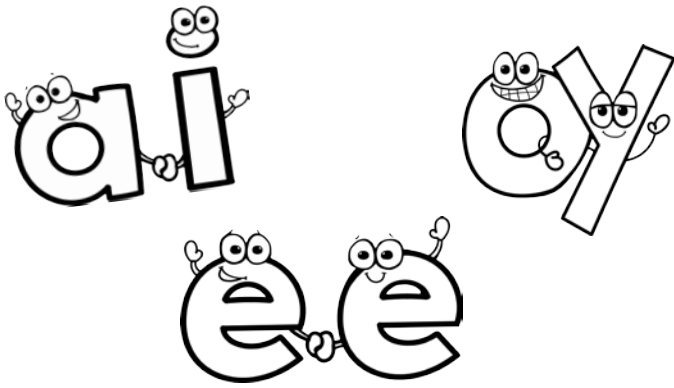

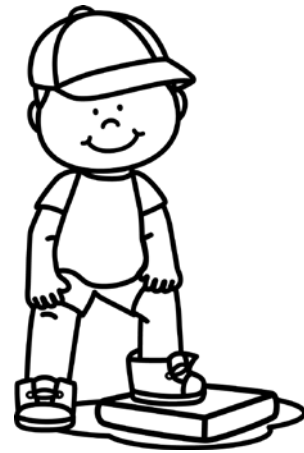

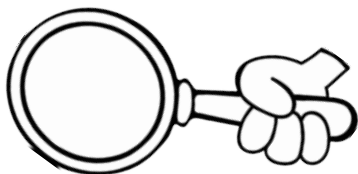

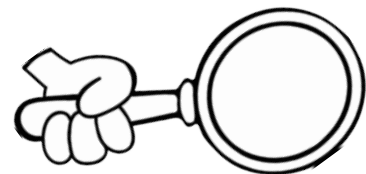

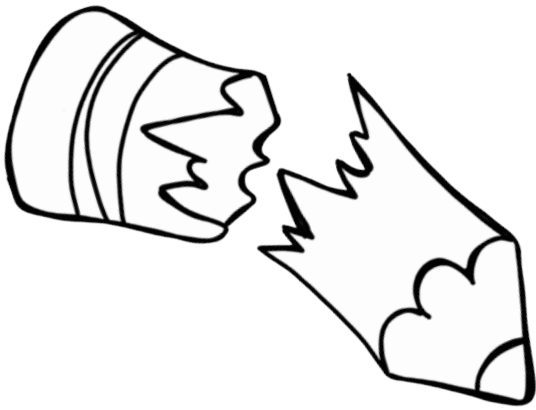

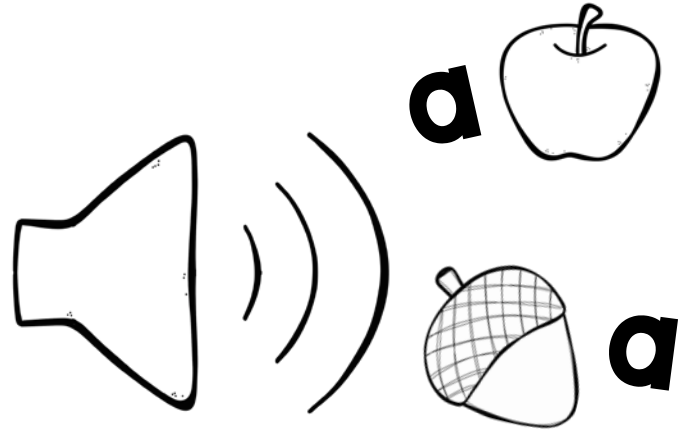
