### How to Plit your Snowmen

Did you know you that you can use these puzzles for MORE than compound words? Use them for ANY kind of two-syllable word. Check out our <u>syllable types post</u> for more two-syllable word ideas!



#### In order to type into the editable fields, follow these steps:

- I. Open the PDF document with the most recent version of Adobe Reader. An older version may work just fine for you. But if you are having trouble, it might be that you need the most recent version.
- 2. To use the same font in this printable, go to <u>Teachers Pay Teachers</u> and login. Download and install <u>KG Second Chances font</u> from Kimberly Geswein to your computer (free for personal use).
- 3. Download and save this PDF to your computer. Use that file to make your edits. If you try to edit before you download the file, you may not be able to see the editable fields.
- 4. Click on and type your words in the blue/gray boxes on each card. The fields maybe hard to see, but they are there! If you do not type words in the boxes, the puzzles will print blank. The words will auto-size for you.
- 5. Save your work or print the pages.

#### \*Troubleshooting Ideas for Mac Users!

- I. Make sure that you have the most current version of Adobe Reader. It's available here.
- 2. Open your file finder and right click (or double click) on the file in your download folder.
- 3. Choose OPEN WITH -> ADOBE READER.
- 4. You may be prompted to choose Adobe Reader as your PDF reader in the future. To avoid problems in the future, click YES.
