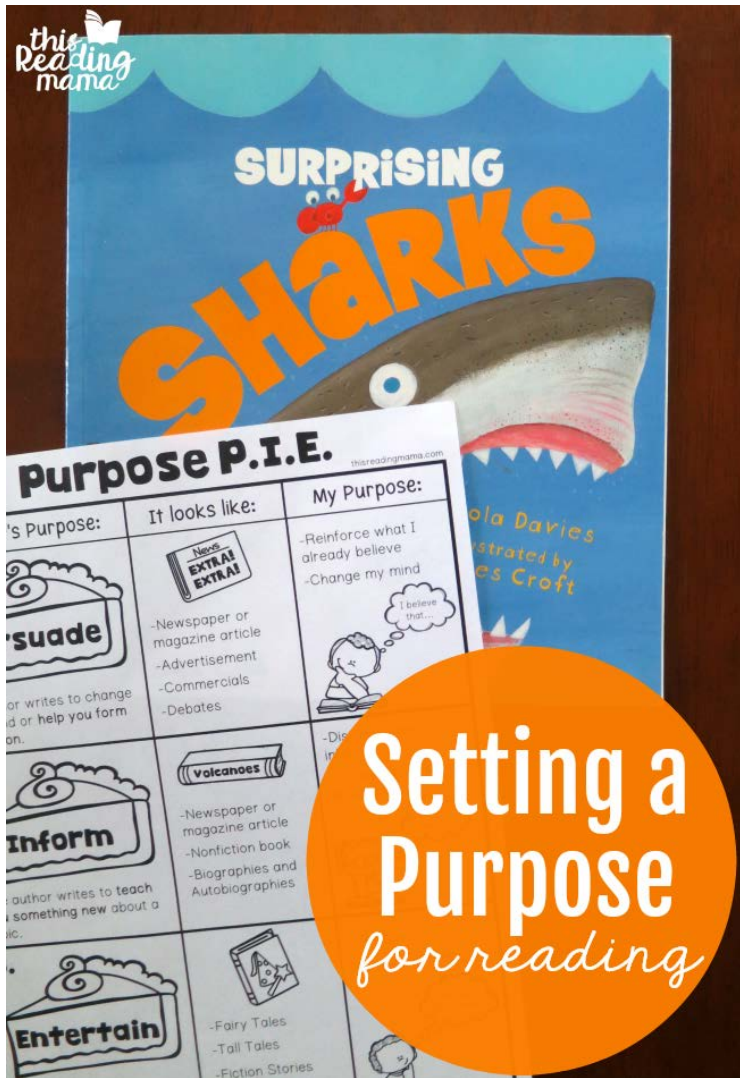


Setting a Purpose with Purpose P.I.E.

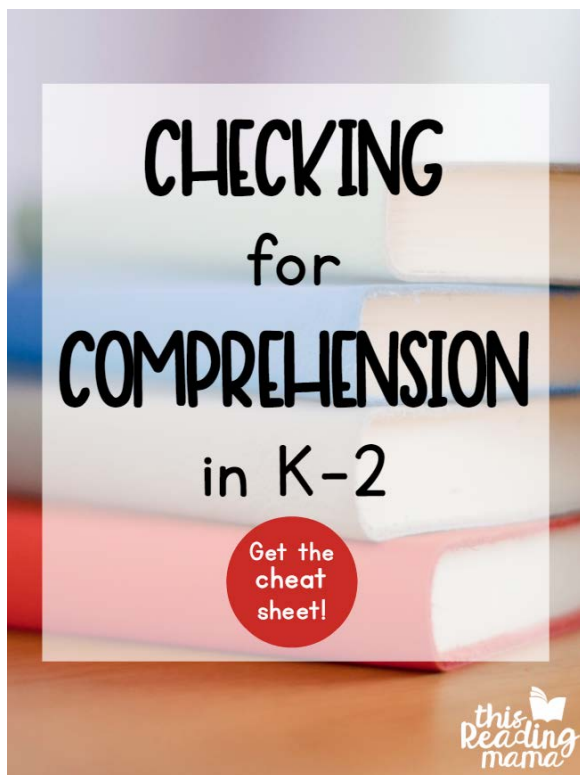
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







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Purpose P.I.E.
